

MANAGER'S NOTEBOOK

Good afternoon to the officials, management team, players and supporters of St Neots Town and to all our regular and new supporters to Creasey Park for this fixture. We are delighted to be able to get straight back on the pitch following our hard fought victory against Weymouth on Tuesday night and look to build on that magnificent performance.

Going into the game on Tuesday we felt very confident. We knew we had performed well in the last game but succumbed to terrible mistakes. We made two changes, one of which was the goalkeeper and Will Hunt came in for his debut and he was terrific. His distribution was excellent and he made two really top class saves to keep us in the game. When you have that behind you it gives the players confidence and belief, which spread quickly.

The back four were excellent, while the midfield stuck to the game plan as we moved Arel deeper and Charlie Black higher, to give us even more pace going forward than normal. It just all clicked. The work-rate was unbelievable and as I have said this week, these players are so resilient and fight for everything. They left nothing on the pitch.

Charlie is one of the most hard working honest players I have ever had the pleasure to work with and he was rewarded for it, when he forced errors from nothing to assist Arel Amu with the second goal.

There is a huge gulf in core structure currently between us and clubs like Weymouth. They are a good team with players with Football League experience and they showed it. For a spell they caused us a problem with their combination play and

movement. But we showed also what a threat we are going forward. I said to the guys beforehand, every report I have had on Weymouth has come back that they are terrific going forward, but not one person or manager has told me what they are like defensively.

For us, we need to find out. We don't fear anyone and we will always have a go. We need a run of form to stay in this league and make history with the only players in the league doing it for free.



12th MAN SCHEME



Dunstable Town currently does not pay any of its players, a unique situation at the level of football that we operate. However, we all know that this is not a sustainable position, and one that the Dunstable Town board are working very hard behind the scenes to rectify.

As we look to build a sustainable club, which only operates within its means, we now believe it is time to build a fund which is 'ring fenced' for player wages. Many clubs operating at our level have similar schemes which supplement the allocated player budget.

So, how does it work?

Supporters can donate via 1) One off donations 2) Monthly Standing Orders 3) A combination of 1 & 2.

The amount of your donation/standing order will of course remain private between the donor and our finance team. This scheme operates throughout the year, and is not limited to the football season.

The Standing Order mandate is available for download from our website, which you can print off and pass to us on match day.

TODAY'S OPPOSITION HISTORY

The Club was formed in 1879 when it was know as plain 'St Neots', the first formal honour recorded being the Hunts Senior Cup in its inaugural season 1888/89. The Club went on to lift that trophy a further four times before the turn of the Century. In the 1901/02 season the Club recorded its first known 'double' when it won the Hunts Senior Cup, for the sixth time, and the Fellowes Cup. In 1924/25 or thereabouts St Neots was renamed 'St Neots and District' and celebrated by winning the Hunts Senior Cup again. At this time in the Club's history, honours seemed to have been primarily from County competitions with the Scott Gatty Cup being won on three consecutive occasions between 1927/29

Unfortunately, no records exist for the next twenty years, although the Hunts Senior Cup was won again on four occasions during this period. In the 1949/50 season the Club were amongst the founder members of the Metropolitan League and recorded a fine League and Cup double but for some reason the Club resigned to join the Central Alliance League. During the 1950's the Club was renamed for the third time to its present name of 'St Neots Town FC' and rejoined the Metropolitan League.

For a decade the Club Manager was former West Ham full back John Gregory who was the first full time official the Club had employed. His son became Manager of Aston Villa FC. In 1961/62 the Club were runners up in the Metropolitan League Professional Cup - a trophy eventually won in 1965 beating Gillingham in the Final. In 1966/67 the Club joined the UCL for a three year spell and in that same season the team progressed through five rounds of the FA Cup to reach the First Round proper for the only time. The draw took us to Fellowes Park, Walsall who were second in the Third Division with an unbeaten home record. The team lost 2-0 with both goals coming in the last nine minutes but the crowd was a record for Walsall in the competition.

The next season the UCL League and Cup double was recorded (the first time the Senior side won the title - although the RESERVE side had won the League in 1956/57!). The League Cup was retained the following season but the next major senior League honour did not come until the 1982/83 season when the team finished runners up in Division One of the UCL.

In 1969/70 the Club opted to join the Eastern Counties (now Ridgeons) League because it was felt it would be a stronger League. In its four years membership Club fortunes declined. The Club then rejoined the UCL in 1973/74. In the next eight seasons the Club had a reasonable run of success finishing at best fourth and at worst nineteenth. At Christmas 1987 the Club was evicted from its long time 'Shortsands' home and had to complete the season on a substandard borrowed works pitch. At the end of that season just four places from the bottom

of the table the Club was forced to disband and then the outstanding debt had to be cleared.

Out of football for just two seasons the Club was reformed in Junior football in the Hunts League with a pitch at Priory Park, St Neots rented from the District Council and the flame of desire to re-establish the Club at Senior level was rekindled. In 1994/95 after a spell of six years absence from senior football they were readmitted to the UCL. The spell in the UCL Premier Division lasted 17 years but in 2008 the Club was relocated around half a mile from their original Rowley Park premises in Cambridge Road to the north end of the loves farm estate as the club approached

its 130th anniversary. In February 2010 Mike Kearns purchased all of the clubs shares to become Owner / Chairman of the club. Club sign ex Aston Villa striker Stefen Moore for a transfer fee of £10,000.

The following season 2010/11 season was the club's best ever. The Championship of the UCL Premier Division was won for only the second time. The club broke a whole raft of league records clocking up a record 105 points and scoring 160 league goals in just 40 matches. Unbeaten away from home in the league the side suffered just one home defeat and picked up the County Senior Cup for the 36th time as well as finishing runners-up in the Hinchingbrooke Cup and reaching the fifth round of the FA Vase. 2011/12 saw the Club reach even greater heights winning the Southern League Central Division in their first season at Step Four to move up to the Southern League Premier Division in 2012/13. Consolidation over the next two seasons saw the club finish mid table on both occasions, the 2013 /14 season saw the club win the Southern League Cup and the Hunts Senior Cup.

Season 2104/15 saw the club under the guidance of First Team manager David Batch finish in fifth position in the Southern League Premier Division, narrowly losing out by a single penalty goal in the play off finish.

2015-2016 season saw the team struggle and David Batch resigned in January 2016 with the club was fighting for step 3 status. Mike Kearns stepped down as chairman at the same time and his majority share holding was acquired by Lee Kearns the MD of the football club. Andy Davies the Academy manager stepped in to steady the ship and ensured step 3 football for the following season. 2016-2017 season started well but once again the mid season jinx struck with Andy stepping down due to ill health. Matt Clements was appointed manager in Late December 2016 and with the full backing of the board has started the process of changing the first team to reflect his own beliefs and football philosophy.

22, started career as a youth team scholar at Peterborough United. completed two years scoring 30 goals from midfield, then stepped into non league football with St Neots Town. Extended non league experience with Tilbury and Waltham Abbey scoring a number of goals and showing confidence in a number of positions.

Taylor Parr

23 Started his playing career at Cambridge Utd making his way through the youth system. Last season he was captain at Godmancher Rovers. A ball winning Centre half with an excellent understanding of the game and a natural leader

Harry O'Malley

Harry, equally at home on either the right or left flank, numbers Histon St Ives Town and Saffron Walden Town, with whom he ended last season, amongst his former clubs. He was a member of the successful St Ives Town Playoff team which won promotion to the Premier Division at the end of the 15/16 season.

Jack Bradshaw

Jack, a familiar face to Saints fans having briefly played under Dennis Greene, joins us from St Ives Town. Right sided Jack can operate comfortably at full back or in midfield. His former clubs include Royston Town and Maidenhead United.

Johnny Herd

Joined from National League South outfit Bishops Stortford, where he has spent the last four and a half seasons. His impressive CV includes 42 appearances for League Two side Southend United after rising through their youth setup.

Dylan Williams

Dylan, an attacking midfielder, joined having been a youth graduate at Cambridge United, and made his first team debut on 19 April 2016, coming on as a substitute in a 7–0 League Two win against Morecambe.

Scott Sinclair

Scott joined the Saints from Barton Rovers and is a cultured centre midfielder.

Luke Knight

Another summer signing form Barton Rovers having also represented Slough Town, Biggleswade and St Ives.

Kyran Wiltshire

A strong creative midfielder signed from Maidenhead United.

Stefan Brocolli

Young and talented versatile player who's previous clubs include Arsenal and NewcastleUtd

Dion Sembie-Ferris

Dion is well known to saints fans having been part of the clubs development system before joining Colchester Utd. An unbelievable talented quick forward who will almost certainly move back into League football in the very near future


Nabil Shariff

DUNSTABLE TOWN 2-1 WEYMOUTH HT (1-0)

With Casey Harker unavailable, Dunstable gave a debut to Will Hunt in goal and welcomed back Andrew Osei-Bonsu to the starting XI. With John Sonuga named as a substitute, Gedeon Okito wore the Captain's armband. Will Hunt was called into early action to make a fine save in the 7th minute as Weymouth sought to impose their authority. Alex Ward tried his luck from outside the area in the 16th minute which needed Will Dennis in the Weymouth goal to be alert and on his toes.

Ryan Young was full of tricks and beat his man on a couple of occasions & served notice of intent when he received a sublime pass from Andrew Osei-Bonsu, which enabled him to cut inside and warm the hands of Will Dennis. A minute later, Young was at it again, down the line he charged, the ball at his feet, almost to the touchline, before curling the ball over the head of Will Dennis and into the back of the net. Dunstable ahead 1-0.

Weymouth came back strongly determined to seek parity. They hit the woodwork & were narrowly off target on a couple of occasions. When shots were on target, unfortunately for them, debutant Will Hunt was found to be in the form of his life. Whatever Weymouth threw his way, Will snapped it up eager to show his metal to Tony & Gareth and stake a claim to the number 1 shirt.

The second half kicked off with Weymouth in attacking mood. Wave upon wave of claret and blue swept towards the near end goal. Will Hunt was again tested early in the second half but found to be on top of his game. A free kick for Weymouth from a dangerous area went over the bar and a collective sigh of relief came from many Dunstable supporters. Then on 65 minutes, Dunstable scored a second goal largely due to Charlie Black who looked to be chasing a lost cause. Charlie snapping at the heels of his opponent, pressured the Weymouth defender into miscuing his back pass which was snapped up by Arel Amu and neatly deposited the ball into the back of the net. Cue wild celebrations between The Regiment and the players.

On came Captain and Leader of men, John Sonuga to help bolster the defence in preparation for the expected onslaught. Weymouth got their reward for all their efforts on 72 minutes with a towering header from a corner by Calvin Brooks. For the second time in the game Weymouth hit the woodwork. Then had a goal disallowed for offside. The Dunstable defence held firm and at the back there was Will Hunt who saved his best moment to almost the last kick of the game with an incredible save in stoppage time which the Weymouth Twitter feed described as "absolutely ridiculous". It really was that good, diving upwards and at full stretch palming the ball away and to safety. A save of genuine class and worthy of being the final decider in a tight and competitive match.

The wet weather claimed four of Saturday's Evo-Stik League South Premier matches, but fortunately the top five all managed to see action.

And the leadership changed hands again after King` Lynn Town were held at The Walks by fourth-placed Weymouth, leaving Kettering Town to return to the summit after a hard-fought 4-2 win at Penydarren Park against Merthyr Town.

In front of 684, Lynn looked to be heading for three crucial points when Simon Lappin broke the deadlock to give them a 75th minute lead. But Brandon Goodship popped up with an 86th minute equaliser for the Terras to make their long journey home a decent one. Lynn lost the leadership though as the Poppies triumphed in Wales after the game survived several inspections.

In front of 556, the visitors took the lead after 9 minutes through Aaron O'Connor. Rene Howe hit the crossbar soon after but he wasn't to be denied after 28 minutes when he headed home to make it 2-0. On-loan Matt Stevens made it 3-0 on 33 minutes and the Poppies went four-up 11 minutes into the second half thanks to Brett Solkhon. But Merthyr went on to finish the game strongly with Kerry Morgan pulling one back 5 minutes later and then Ian Traylor made some visiting nerve ends tingle when he pulled a second back 5 minutes from time.

A big away following boosted the Avenue Stadium attendance to 909 as Hereford FC moved into third place with a 1-0 win against lowly Dorchester Town. But a Lance Smith header just past the hour-mark was all that separated the sides in the end.

Tiverton Town were the only member of the top five to lose as the Yellows suffered a surprise 3-2 defeat to a now fourth-bottom St Ives Town at Ladysmead. It was a terrific performance by the Saints, especially as they trailed 2-0 to goals from Levi Landricombe

after 21 minutes and Jamie Price on 46 minutes. Ollie Snaith's penalty reduced the arrears 10 minutes into the second half and then Snaith scored from open play to equalise 15 minutes from time, with the winner coming from Declan Rogers in stoppage time.

Royston Town's six-game unbeaten league run came to an end as the Crows suffered a 2-0 Garden Walk defeat to a Chesham United side who are now just a couple of points behind them in ninth. It was veteran striker Jefferson Louis who won the day for the Generals with a brace in the 33rd and 77th minutes – the second from the spot.

Second-bottom Dunstable Town are just two points above bottom-markers Gosport Borough but have played three more games now after they suffered a 4-0 drubbing at the Rushmoor Community Stadium against Farnborough. A Dan Walker penalty after just 8 minutes set Boro up and just 3 minutes later, Perry Coles added a second. Jack Barton made it 3-0 in the 56th minute and Manny Omrore made it game over in the 77th minute.

Frome Town enjoyed the day's most emphatic win, 6-1 at St Neots Town. It was 2-0 at the break through Darren Jefferies after 8 minutes and Joe Raynes on 32 minutes. Chas Hemmings after 53 minutes and Mitch Page 4 minutes later killed the game off as a contest, with Ryan Bath bagging a late brace in the 76th an 88th minutes ahead of Dion Sembie-Ferris' last-gasp consolation for the beleagured Saints.

Kings Langley gave themselves a boost by coming back to earn a late point at Redditch United. The hosts led 2-0 with goals from Tristan Dunkley after 6 minutes and Ashley Sammons just before the break. Mitchell Weiss reduced the deficit after 65 minutes, and then 4 minutes into stoppage time, Weiss grabbed Kings` leveller.









27 JANUARY 2013 - A HAT-TRICK PERFECTED

On 27 January 2013, Cristiano Ronaldo scored a perfect hat-trick in an 11-minute span as Real Madrid beat Getafe 4-0.

The defending champions, Real Madrid started the day in third, chasing Atletico Madrid and Barcelona for the league title. They had additional incentive to win in order to avenge their away loss to Getafe from August.

Still, despite a handful of early chances, it took until the 54th minute for Real Madrid to take the lead with Sergio Ramos bundling the ball home after a goalmouth scramble.

Eight minutes later, Ronaldo doubled the lead with a left-footed shot that beat a defender and the keeper to the far post; the 300th goal of his club career. Then, in the 65th minute, he scored with a header to push the margin to 3-0. Finally, he added a 72nd-minute penalty, scored with his right foot to complete the perfect hat-trick.

Madrid went on to take 42 of 51 available points over the remainder of the season, but finished as runners-up to Barcelona.
