## A WELCOME FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

I would like to welcome the officials, management team, players and supporters of Gosport Borough to Creasey Park for this evening's fixture. Firstly, it is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Keith Wilsher, one of our fans. We will be holding a minute's silence for Keith prior to the match.

The matches are coming thick and fast at this time of the season as clubs play catch-up by completing rearranged league games that originally fell victim to the extreme weather conditions we have faced that has included snow and torrential rain leading to frozen and waterlogged pitches.

The club has done very well in putting on matches when bad weather has occurred. It has sought to make every effort to ensure a match will take place on its designated date, as this helps with the smooth running of the league programme for all concerned. We have created a process where we have a series of actions we take in case we need to have a match-day pitch inspection that could lead to a postponement. We make sure we check the long-term weather forecasts; we work and liaise with Creasey Park facility management and grounds staff in relation to stadium safety issues and pitch maintenance; inform the opposition club well in advance that there could be issues; agree a protocol with the opposition club as to when they need to be notified if a game is called off; appoint a local pitch inspection referee who will liaise with the match-day referee if there is an inspection; we keep league officials appraised of the situation; and we use our social media to keep fans updated, particularly so away fans do not make wasted and ultimately costly journeys. This has been no easy task but one which we have achieved effectively this season.

This is achieved because of the culture and ethos of the club that puts the fans at the centre of its being as well as acknowledging and respecting fans at this level who put so much into their clubs, be they supporters or volunteers.

As I have said before, volunteers are essential to non-league clubs and as we plan for next season, I call out to our fans and enthusiastic members of our local community to step forward and volunteer to assist the club in whatever capacity so it can continue to grow on-and-off the field.



As we look to build a sustainable club , which only operates within its means, we now believe it is time to build a fund which is 'ring fenced' for player wages. Many clubs operating at our level have similar schemes which supplement the allocated player budget.

The Standing Order mandate is available for download from our website, which you can print off and pass to us on match day.



## TODAY'S OPPOSITION HISTORY

Gosport Borough Athletic Club were founded in 1944 in an initiative to bring back organised football, athletics, swimming and cycling to the town of Gosport after a break of several years. Under the management of the long-serving former club skipper Tony Brickwood and Peter Edgar, Gosport won the Hampshire League title in successive seasons (1976–77 and 1977–78) and were elected to the Southern Football League. In the team's first four seasons they never finished outside the top four and when the League was restructured for the start on the 1982–83 season, Gosport were placed in the Premier Division.

The club enjoyed their highest ever finish in the 1988–89 season, when seventh place in the Premier Division was achieved. Unfortunately, a mass exodus of players and a change in the management saw the team relegated to the Southern Division the following season, before a further relegation to the Wessex League in 1992. At the start of the 2000–01 season, Vice-Chairman John Stimpson was elected to the Chairmanship of the club. He immediately agreed with Marsh that the club should continue to develop young local players and also look to include a mix of more experienced players in the first team.

In December 2005 the club appointed Alex Pike as first team manager. Pike came to Gosport with relative pedigree, having the honour of being the Wessex League's most successful manager; having won league and league cup honours on several occasions with his teams and also winning the FA Vase with Wimborne Town in 1992, his appointment seemed appropriate for a club aiming for promotion back to the Southern League. In his first full season in charge, Pike lived up to his high reputation, and Boro' lifted the Wessex League championship title – their first title in 29 years. The championship was won on the last day of the season at title rivals AFC Totton; Boro' had to avoid defeat by two goals to lift the title and, in a nervous afternoon, eventually lost 1–0 to win the championship on goal difference.

Things started well for The Boro' on their return to the Southern League – at one point the side sat third in the Southern League Division One South & West table. However, a poor run of results before and after the Christmas period saw Gosport falling off the pace and towards the lower reaches of the table, before a more balanced side picked themselves up and strung together a solid run of results to lift the team to a creditable 11th-placed finish by the end of the campaign. A better season followed in 2009–10, with the club threatening to achieve a play-off place all season before trailing off in the last few weeks, eventually finishing 8th but the upward momentum failed to continue into 2010–11. From the outset, Alex Pike's side stuttered through their league season – mainly due to poor form away from home, which saw the team record only four wins on the road all season. With the side rarely able to put together a run of more than a couple of wins, The Boro' slipped down the table and finished the season in 13th position, their worst since rejoining the Southern League. However, the 2011–12 was considerably better with Gosport continually well placed in the table, finally finishing in third place to qualify for the play-offs. Boro' won their semi against near neighbours Sholing thanks to a superb strike by the division's leading goalscorer

Justin Bennett. In the final, away at Poole Town, Gosport trailed 0–1 until veteran striker Steve Claridge came off the bench and scored in the second minute of injury time to level the tie at 1–1, taking the game to extra-time. In extra-time, Gosport scored twice to regain their place in the Southern League Premier Division for the first time since 1990.

2012–2013 started indifferently, with the club initially in danger of relegation. However, after a run of poor results it required results elsewhere and a narrow 1–0 victory on the last day of the season to take them into the final play off place. A win against 2nd placed Stourbridge and a play-off final win against Hemel Hempstead (2–2 after extra time, 4–5 on penalties) saw the club promoted to the Conference South for the first time in the club's history.

The club initially struggled through the first two thirds of the 2013–14 season as they came to grips with life in the Conference South. But a run in the FA Trophy gelled the team and the league performances followed. As the team progressed through round after round of the Trophy, they also climbed the league table – eventually moving well clear of the drop zone. During the 2014–15 season, Borough qualified for the first round proper of the FA Cup for the first time in their history. They were drawn against League One side Colchester United; the club installed additional seating and terracing to raise the capacity of Privett Park to 4,800 for the match, which was played on Sunday 9 November 2014 and resulted in a 3–6 victory for Colchester. Boro' went on to finish sixth in the Conference South, missing out on the play-offs by just three points. They did however cap another fine season by winning the Hampshire Senior Cup for the first time since 1988.

The 2015–16 season got off to a good start with the club pushing themselves into play-off contention from the off but as the new year came, the club were hit with financial problems. Several players left the club in February and March after the club failed to pay their wages and an unpaid tax bill meant The Boro' were under a transfer embargo and could not replace the players they'd lost. As 2016-17 started, it was hoped by all at the club that their financial issues had been resolved when a party came forward offering to invest in the club. But before the season had even started, the backer had walked away - leaving a massive hole in the club's finance plans. It was the start of a traumatic season.

On the pitch, the season started well and Gosport were making steady headway in the top half of the table but in the background the club's financial issues began to take hold. The club missed a tax payment and HMRC issued a winding up order - the first of four Gosport would face during the season. Throughout the whole season there had been talk of a takeover with several interested parties coming and going. Alongside this uncertainty off the pitch, the team struggled in the National League South. By February 2017 they lay six points adrift of safety and relegation appeared inevitable. Despite a late rally in March, highlighted by a 4–0 win over St Albans City and a 1–0 defeat of Bath City, the renewed form did not last and relegation was confirmed in the penultimate game of the season.

Lanre Ladipo hobbled off on 19 minutes to be replaced by Erin Amu who got stuck in straight away and helped nullify the normally free scoring Basingstoke attack.

Five minutes later Dunstable were indebted to Daniel Trif for an outstanding piece of defensive work matched on the stroke of half time by Gedeon Okito who had rather unluckily found himself in the referee's notebook on 35 minutes after being on the receiving end of a heavy Basingstoke challenge.

Within a couple of minutes of the restart Andrew Osei-Bonsu let fly with a stinging shot which caused Basingstoke stopper Colm Mcadden to fling himself to his left to parry the ball to safety.

Six minutes later Nathan Harness in the Dunstable goal pulled off a wonderful save to keep the scores level. A minute later the Dunstable defence was breached by the very impressive, Dan Bayliss to give Basingstoke the lead.

With just one goal separating the sides Dunstable started to gain the ascendancy and began to make further inroads into the Basingstoke danger areas. There, however, they found Basingstoke captain, Guri Demuria in commanding and masterful form. He marshalled his back line with intelligence and experience and limited Dunstable's chances.

At the other end and in equally commanding form was Nathan Harness who produced another strong display and who, on 72 minutes when he went down bravely at the feet of an oncoming Basingstoke forward, kept Dunstable in the game.

However even Nathan was unable to stop Callum Bunting from seemingly putting the game to bed in the 89th minute with Basingstoke's second goal. Game over surely.

In the first minute of stoppage time, Arel Amu powered through the Basingstoke backline and rounded the goalkeeper only for the ball to hit a bobble on the pitch and spin back to hit his heel and fall kindly for Colm Mcadden to get to his knees and pounce on the ball with Arel already a yard ahead. When that happens you just know it's not going to be your day.

A massive crowd of 4,556 at Edgar Street saw Hereford FC crowned champions of the Evo-Stik League South Premier on Saturday. The Bulls had already clinched the title before taking the pitch against third-placed Kettering Town, who needed the points more than the hosts to obtain a preferable top five spot. And it often happens that in occasions like this, the title-winners can fall a little flat on the day, but not Peter Beadle's side, who romped to a 4-1 win, thanks to a three-goal burst in 4 minutes, starting with Dara O'Shea's 12th minute opener and added to by the retiring Rob Purdie and Lance Smith. Matt Stevens reduced the deficit 4 minutes into the second half, but the Poppies conceded a fourth and a second for Smith in the 68th minute. Defeat leaves Kettering third, three points behind King's Lynn Town with a game in hand and only a point separating the others in the top five race.

Lynn could only draw on Saturday at The Walks against mid-table St Neots Town. In front of 884, Michael Gash broke the deadlock to give the Linnets a 78th minute lead, but Nabil Shariff grabbed an 86th minute equaliser for the Saints.

Fourth-placed Weymouth edged a five-goal thriller at Gaywood Park against fourth-bottom Kings Langley. Brandon Goodship gave the Terras the lead right on the stroke of half-time. But Jorell Johnson's 77th minute equaliser looked as though it was going to be a spoiler for the visitors – until late drama. Harry Baker came off the bench for the Terras and made an instant impact, laying the ball off for Goodship to net his 37th league goal of the season in the 86th minute. A minute into stoppage time, Baker finishes this game as a contest with his 19th goal of the season. But Steve Ward netted a terrific second for Kings 2 minutes later but it was too late to make a difference.

Taking on Terras' rivals Slough Town in the top five battle were Dorset neighbours Dorchester Town. But they failed to do them a favour as a goal 6 minutes from time from Perry Coles saw the Rebels travel back to Berkshire with the points and, as Kettering and

Slough have a game in hand on Weymouth, they are looking the more likely to finish higher.

Elsewhere on Saturday, Royston Town's first season at Premier level has been a terrific success, despite missing out on the play-offs. If someone had told manager Steve Castle that his team would finish in the top eight at the start of the season, I am sure he would have been delighted, and a 4-0 win at Garden Walk against Biggleswade Town leaves the Crows sixth, three points above Tiverton Town and six of Chesham United with two games remaining. Lee Chappell and Adam Marriott scored within a minute of each other in the 17th and 18th minutes and then Marriott's penalty on 63 minutes killed the game off, with Michael Baulk adding a fourth 12 minutes from time.

Tiverton lost 3-2 at Redditch United, whose Stuart Fleetwood gave them an early 2nd minute lead. Jared Lewington equalised just 5 minutes later but Adam Page bagged a brace in the 19th and 73rd minutes, sandwiching a 67th minute Tom Bath reply, to win it for the Reds.

Chesham also lost, 2-0 at the Rushmoor Community Stadium against Farnborough, for whom Michael Elias-Fernandes after 42 minutes and then a Matt Campbell-Mhlope second in stoppage time were on the mark. A Robbie Burns goal 2 minutes into stoppage time at the end of the game won the game for Hitchin Town at Top Field against Hertfordshire rivals Bishop's Stortford, while a strike just a minute or so earlier from Kaine Macauley gave Basingstoke Town a similar outcome at Stratford Town.

Banbury United and Merthyr Town shared a six-goal thriller at the Spencer Stadium. Ian Traylor's 39th minute penalty gave the Martyrs' first half supremacy, only for Leam Howards to level within 5 minutes of the second half kicking-off. Howards' second gave the Puritans the lead after 69 minutes and Owain Jones levelled 5 minutes later. Parity lasted barely a minute though as Elliot Sandy made it 3-2 to the hosts, but a second for Jones in stoppage time earned the Welsh side a point.



## 26 APRIL 1902 - THE NAME CHANGE SEEMS TO HAVE WORKED

On 26 April 1902, English Second Division side Newton Heath F.C. changed its name. The club, nicknamed the Heathens, was founded in 1878 by workers from the Newton Heath depot of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, located in the city of Manchester. Their origins were reflected in the team's original name - Newton Heath L&YR F.C. They joined the Second Division of the Football League in 1893, dropping the "L&YR" from their name.

By 1902, the Heathens were in financial trouble. Their debts - which had climbed to over £2,500 - threatened to force them into bankruptcy. The club captain, Harry Stafford, met with J.H. Davies, the managing director of the nearby Manchester Breweries. Stafford persuaded Davies to make a substantial investment, allowing the club to continue. In return, Davies became club president.

The team decided to adopt a new name and colors in celebration of their new ownership and fresh start. They abandoned their gold and green shirts for red and white and, after considering such names as "*Manchester Central*" and "*Manchester Celtic*," decided to call themselves Manchester United F.C. They were promoted to the First Division soon after, in 1906, and won their first league title in 1908.

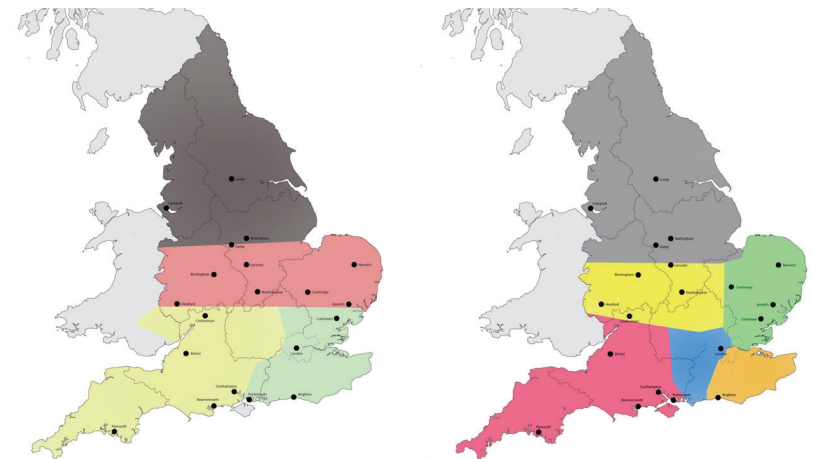

It's the biggest shake-up in the Non-League game since 2004... and now the FA has revealed what it might look like. From 2018/19, an extra division will be added at Steps 3 and 4. The FA's Leagues Committee has released provisional Step 3 and 4 league boundaries ahead of next season's National League System restructuring. At their meeting on February 6, the Committee decided the principles to be applied when allocating clubs at the two steps.

The Committee decision was taken after hearing the results of two exercises, the first using the tables at the end of last season (2016/17) and the second based on the tables as of January 2 2018. It is emphasised by the FA that, for the time being, this is a guide only and they have deliberately not included names of clubs because the full allocation can only be made when the identities of the constituent clubs are known.

It is clarified that this is for season 2018/19 and the make-up of clubs in future seasons may alter this approach. At Step 3, the decision is to implement a north division, a central 'band' from the east coast to the west of Birmingham, together with south west and south east divisions, as shown in The NLP's graphic below.



At Step 4, the seven areas will be divided as shown in The NLP's graphic below. The Isthmian League has responsibility for the green, blue and orange areas, the Southern League administers the yellow and pink areas and the Northern Premier League in the area coloured black. The Northern Premier League is calling a meeting of its clubs to decide whether to remain with a north/south split or to change to an east/west allocation. *By Alex Narey*
