# NEWPORT PAGNELL TOWN HISTORY

Newport Pagnell Town Football Club was founded in 1963, initially as Newport Pagnell Wanderers, playing on Bury Field Common.

In 1964 they entered the North Bucks League and won Division 3 in their first season. Soon after that they won the Division 2 and Division 1 titles in consecutive years.

In the 1971-72 season the Wanderers joined the South Midlands League, playing at the Youth Club in Wolverton Road.

In 1972 the club moved to the new facilities at the Willen Road Sports Ground and changed its name to Newport Pagnell Town.

In the 1973-74 season Newport Pagnell Town joined Division 2 of the United Counties League. Two years later they were promoted to Division 1. They won the Division 1 Championship in 1981-82 and were promoted to the Premier Division.

A few ups and downs followed during the next two decades: relegated in 1985-86, promoted back to the Premier Division in 1991-92, and then relegated again in 1996-97.

The club won the Division 1 Championship again in 2001-02 and has been in the Premier Division ever since.

In 2009-10 and again in 2010-11 the club won the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy.

The best FA Cup achievement was reaching the Second Qualifying Round in 2008-09.

In the 2016-17 season the club reached the last 8 of the FA Vase before losing to

a strong South Shields team (the eventual winners of

the competition) in front of more than 3000 spectators on Tyneside. In recognition of this achievement the club was presented with a Town Award by Newport Pagnell Town Council, and in the Milton Keynes Sports Achiever of the Year 2017 awards Newport Pagnell Town Football Club's first team received the Team of the Year award.

A further award in 2017 was a Berks & Bucks FA award to the club chairman, Steve Handley, for his contribution to grassroots football.

In 2017-18 the club finished third in the UCL Premier Division, missing out on promotion by just three points. A good season for the youth section included winning the Berks & Bucks Under 15 county cup and also a very encouraging season for the club's first girls team, the Under 12 Swans.

From small beginnings in 1963, Newport Pagnell Town has become the highest placed non-league club in the Milton Keynes area, and is a FA Charter Standard Community Club, with a youth section of around 30 teams in addition to its senior first and reserve teams and a successful Sunday team.

At the end of the 2018–19 season they were transferred to the Premier Division of the Spartan South Midlands League.





# REPORTING IN

OUR ROVING REPORTER PATRICK MACKAY'S ACCOUNT OF OUR RECENT MATCH AGAINST WEMBLEY

The first half was a tight affair, with chances for both sides within the opening five minutes, Daniel Trif going close for Dunstable, and moments later a Wembley attacker found himself rounding Mackenzie Taylor at speed, before losing both his footing and the ball.

Wembley showed their attacking intent in the early stages, but Dunstable looked steady and organised at the back, with Joe Zunguzah and Eric Ameyaw being singled out for praise by the manager after the game. Mackenzie Taylor was putting in another high quality performance, with important first half saves from Ethan Tyrer and Stephen Ebonine.

In the twenty-first minute, a fantastic moment of individual skill saw Chris Stapleton cut in from the right hand side, jink past three defenders and send a curling left-footer just wide of the target. That was as close as the Blues had come to breaking the deadlock until debutant Harry Shepherd headed goalwards from close range, the reflexes of Raheem Belgrave in the Wembley goal were found to be exemplary.

With forty-eight minutes played, Davide Pobbe floated a set piece into a dangerous area, only to see it headed away by the Wembley defence. Chris Stapleton chased the ball down, and being the inventive player he is, teed himself up for an audacious overhead kick from twenty yards. Unfortunately for him, he didn't make clean contact with the ball, but fortunately for Town, his scuffed effort landed right at the feet of Luke Little, who fired an emphatic shot past Belgrave, for his seventh goal of the campaign.

Evans Lamboh came close with a free kick from thirty yards, testing the keeper well, but Wembley were not going to be compliant in defeat, and pressed Dunstable hard for the last half hour.

With a quarter of an hour left to play, Wembley were awarded a penalty when Adam Sawyer brought down his man. Yassine Fehmi-Gil stepped up, and with the weight of expectation on his shoulders struck a ferocious shot against the bar. Relief for all in blue, but a reminder that the one goal margin is always a fragile one.

Looking to extend their lead and give themselves breathing space, it was Lamboh who burst through the Wembley defence, beating their right back for pace before cutting the ball back for Little in the middle, but the pass was intercepted well. Wembley had more good chances towards the end, notably a free kick from the edge of the penalty area which was smashed against the frame of the goal, with the ball ending up in the back of the net from the resulting phase of play, but the linesman's flag was raised.

Leandro Riberio-Mateus looked to capitalise when a deflected pass saw him with a lot of the goal to aim at from ten yards out, but deciding to place it low, Mackenzie Taylor was down to his left quickly, another fine save from the young goalkeeper.

'I thought we were composed and exploited space well,' manager Jackson said after the final whistle. 'We rode our luck a bit towards the end, but ultimately we showed character and kept going till the very end. I'm very proud of the lads.'

The departure of the former Dagenham & Redbridge and Woking boss, pictured, after less than a year in charge was announced only hours after the lunchtime dismissal of Craig Hignett at Hartlepool United.

Watson, 45, quit as Hungerford number two last month to switch to Stonebridge Road as Hill's number two. He will be at the helm for this weekend's home game with Maidenhead United. He takes charge of a side two points adrift at the bottom of the table and six points from safety.

Hill, 59, had been at the helm since November 2018 and left in the wake of Tuesday night's 4-2 reverse at home to Torquay United, his side's third defeat in a row.

A club statement confirming his exit read: "Ebbsfleet United have today parted company with manager Garry Hill following Tuesday's 4-2 defeat at home to Torquay United.

The result left Fleet two points adrift at the bottom of the National League table and six from safety.

"Assistant manager Kevin Watson has been placed in charge of first-team affairs and will take charge of the side for this Saturday's home match versus Maidenhead United.

"The club wishes to place on record its very great thanks to Garry Hill who has worked tirelessly to improve the team's situation this season.

"He was appointed last November and guided the club from 16th to eighth place, while helping oversee the financial restructuring necessary to the club's long-term future."

With half time approaching, Hayes had another great opportunity as their number ten was bearing down on goal at high speed from the right, but he decided to try a shot from eight yards with his left foot, and somehow got

it all wrong and saw it well wide of the right hand post.

Dunstable started the second half much the brighter side, looking creative when Ismael Toure and Scott Collins linked well with a clever free kick, but a tempting Collins cross was headed away to safety.

With an hour on the clock, a scrappy move saw the ball fall to Osae just over twenty yards from goal, and he was looking to provide the magic that would breath life into the game, but his curling effort was just too high.

A second yellow card for AFC Hayes' number eight meant the Blues would have a numerical advantage for the last twenty minutes, but despite good chances falling to both sides in the final stages of the game, neither goal was breached and the game finished goalless.

Encouraging signs for the development team, but ultimately there will be a frustration that they didn't get all three points.


We also have

### 12 OCTOBER 1965 - CHILE GETS THEIR TICKET TO EUROPE

On 12 October 1965, Chile beat Ecuador in a playoff to qualify for their first European World Cup.

They were coming off their best showing in the tournament, finishing in third place as hosts in 1962. But they had never played in a World Cup hosted by a European country, withdrawing from Italy '34 and France '38 and failing to qualify for Switzerland '54 and Sweden '58.

To reach England for the 1966 edition, they had to get through a CONMEBOL qualification group whose other members were Ecuador and Colombia. After four games each, Chile and Ecuador had identical records, with each having two wins, a draw, and a loss. Although Chile had a better goal differential and beat Ecuador 3-1 in the last scheduled match of the group, the rules ranked the teams by points

only, forcing a decision through a playoff.

The teams met in the neutral location of Lima, Peru, where Leonel Sánchez (pictured)--the hero of Chile's 1966 World Cup performance-opened the scoring in the 16th minute, followed by a goal from Rubén Marcos in the 40th minute to stake Chile to a 2-0 lead at the break. Ecuador finally managed to get on the scoreboard in the 89th minute, but it was nothing more than a consolation goal.

The 2-1 win sent Chile to England, but they were unable to recapture their form from the previous tournament and were eliminated in the group stage.


