Luke Little and his family endured a family tragedy during the lockdown which left all of us at the Club devastated for Luke. We fully understand his reasons for wanting to play this season at a less competitive level and wish him all the best for the future.

To Luke, Eric & Seb, thank you for everything you have done for the Club, and to all the other lads who graced the field in our colours last season and have moved on thank you as well and good luck with your new clubs.

There were no thunderstorms, pitch inspections or last minute postponements due to waterlogged pitches when after 148 days since we'd last kicked a ball in a serious match the lads got us off to winning ways in a 2 -0 victory against MK Gallacticos on the 8th August at a deserted Creasey Park.

Goals from Joe Hankins and Dan Trif were enough to see the Blues home against a well organised opposition who finished strongly in Spartan Div 2 last season. Next up, three days later were Aston Clinton who again gave a good account of themselves last season. Joe Hankins was again on the scoresheet as the Blues ran out 2 -0 winners again.

Last year I was driving to Torquay and had reached Stonehenge when Press Officer, Steve Lewington rang me to describe several times the overhead kick Chris "Stapes" Stapleton had scored away at MK Unite. Scored in front of the TV cameras in higher leagues and that goal wins goal of the day/week/month/season awards. I was determined this season not to make such a catastrophic error of judgement and thus have seen every minute of every game including the 5 -2 reverse away at Winslow on Friday 14th August,

I should know better at my age. Cockiness is a sin. There we are 50 minutes played and two up against a strong Winslow side. It is though, a very bittersweet compliment. Good luck to all three lads we wish you all well as you step up the pyramid.

Next up was a trip to Broadwater in Berkhamsted where some lovely free flowing football was rewarded with a fine 4 – 1 victory against Berkhamsted Comrades.

Bedford Town pulled out of a fixture due to be played on the 27th August to be replaced by Kings Langley. Rainfall of biblical proportions left the goalmouths with standing water in puddles and the game was sadly postponed.

The Football Association have today issued updated guidelines for the National League System (NLS) and Women's Football Pyramid (WFP) that include a phased and limited return of spectators for clubs at Steps 3-6 and tiers 3-4 respectively.

Football's governing body has worked continuously alongside the Department for Digital, Culture, Media & Sport (DCMS), the Sports Grounds Safety Authority (SGSA) and leagues to submit detailed proposals for the return of spectators at these levels to the Government.

Steps 1 and 2 of the NLS fall under the 'elite sport guidance' and are awaiting further information on when they can permit crowds.

The DCMS has now clarified its guidance on the return to recreational team sport and clubs at Steps 3-6 of the NLS and tiers 3-4 of the WFP are permitted to accommodate a phased and limited return of spectators to fixtures. However, they must follow the UK Government's guidance in relation to COVID-19 and The FA's updated guidelines for the NLS or WFP respectively.

In addition, regional NLS feeder league clubs and clubs at tiers five to six of the WFP are permitted to accommodate socially-distanced spectators in line with the guidelines for grassroots football.

All clubs at Steps 3-6 of the NLS and tiers 3-4 of the WFP are required to have a designated COVID-19 officer; complete and publish bespoke risk assessments and action plans; and arrange support for Track and Trace efforts before implementing the following:

Stage one:

From 22 August 2020 to 30 August 2020, spectators are permitted to attend fixtures at Steps 3-6of the NLS and tiers three to four of

the WFP, providing that their number does not exceed 15 per cent of the minimum ground grading capacity at these levels or respective figures set out within the updated guidelines

If a club at these levels does not play any fixtures during this period, it must have played at least one pre-season or competitive fixture in accordance with its respective level of spectators before moving on to stage two

Stage two:

From 31 August 2020, clubs at steps three to six of the NLS and tiers three to four of the WFP will be permitted to allow spectators to attend fixtures provided that their number does not exceed 30 per cent of the minimum ground grading capacity at their level or the respective figures set out within our updated guidelines. However, they must be satisfied that they have been able to comply with the Government's guidance on the return to recreational team sport and our updated guidelines

The phased and limited return of spectators at these levels will be kept under constant review in line with the Government's guidelines and will be amended accordingly as required.
