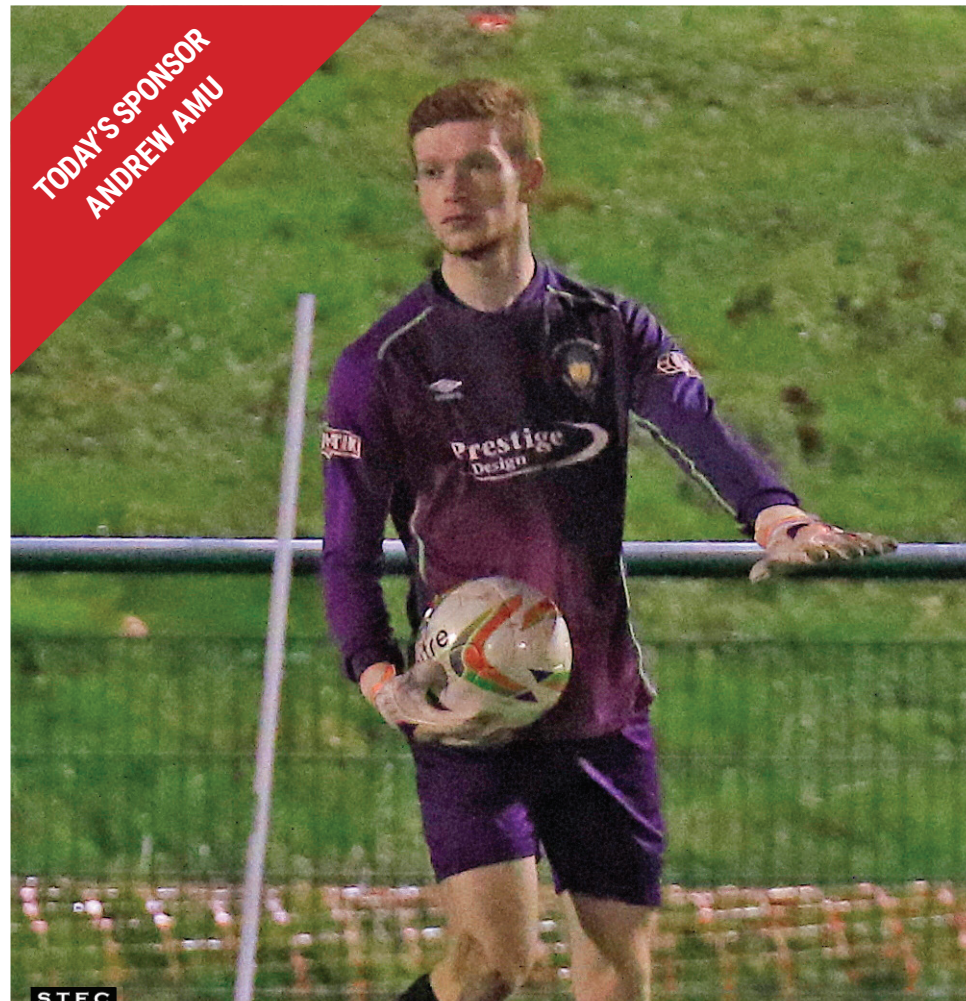

We were on the back of two good performances which would have put us in a reasonable position in the form table going to King's Lynn, only for us to lose 7 players due to injuries and availability. This of course makes things tough, especially when 3 of our 4 centre backs were ruled out. We always roll with the punches and you have to respect the few people that follow us around and support us despite our position. That was foremost in my mind during the warm up, as I could hear them shouting us on, was I am desperate for us to repay that loyalty. We've also seen Charlie Black return to training and we have signed Ionnis Asvestopoulos who has some good pedigree and fits our profile as a young group of players looking to springboard their career back into life.

We are really looking to go into lock down mode now in terms of players in and out. That's ideal of course because with non contracted players we can't control that, what we have earned though is good will from these players and I cannot see the core group going anywhere after several have been offered very reasonable money elsewhere and declined in order to remain and complete this job. Absolutely fantastic! I've always said though that if a football league offer comes I would absolutely welcome their departure and have always told them I'm pro-actively trying to help them in their careers when I think they are ready. It's what the club made clear from the start. Pathways in and pathways out. We are maybe close to a example of that.

Enjoy the game and as we now enter into the final two months, please more than ever, get behind the lads as always, enjoy the game and let's make history together.



12th MAN SCHEME



Dunstable Town currently does not pay any of its players, a unique situation at the level of football that we operate. However, we all know that this is not a sustainable position, and one that the Dunstable Town board are working very hard behind the scenes to rectify.

As we look to build a sustainable club, which only operates within its means, we now believe it is time to build a fund which is 'ring fenced' for player wages. Many clubs operating at our level have similar schemes which supplement the allocated player budget.

So, how does it work ?

Supporters can donate via 1) One off donations 2) Monthly Standing Orders 3) A combination of 1 & 2.

The amount of your donation/standing order will of course remain private between the donor and our finance team. This scheme operates throughout the year, and is not limited to the football season.

The Standing Order mandate is available for download from our website, which you can print off and pass to us on match day.

TODAY'S OPPOSITION HISTORY

Stratford Town where formed in 1941, but it was not until the mid 50's when they joined the Worcestershire Combination (later to become the Midland Combination in 1954), that they had any success on the pitch.

In their first season, Stratford finished 4th. In 1956 Stratford were runners-up and the following year they won the title by 5 points from Wolverhampton Wanderers. In 1955-56 Stratford reached the Challenge Cup Final, but were beaten by Bromsgrove Rovers. Between 1954 and 1957 the Club played 102 games, winning 65, drawing 15 and losing 21, scoring 313 goals and conceded 138. As a result, Stratford decided to join the Birmingham and District League and were in Div. 2 for 3 years, before the League was reorganised. It was a very strong League and Stratford's fortunes slipped, although they did win the Birmingham Senior Cup beating Lockheed Leamington in the Final 2-1 in 1963, the game was played at Moor Green, and Sid Keenan scored both goals.

In 1970-71 Stratford went back to the Midland Combination, where they stayed for 5 seasons before joining the Hellenic League. In their first season, they finished 10th but the next year they finished bottom and they went back to the Midland Combination. However, lack of success continued as they finished with only 13 points and were relegated to Div.2. Being relegated gave the Club time to regroup and within 3 years they were back in the premier Division. After winning the League in 1987, Stratford applied to join the southern League, but the Ground was not up to standard. A new Club House and Changing Rooms were built and floodlights were installed in 1990.

In 1994 Stratford were elected as a founder member of the Midland Football Alliance and finished 3rd in their first season. To cap this, Andy Smith was voted MFA player of the season. In 1997-98 the Club suffered severe financial problems, and a number of local business men got together and took over the Club to get it back on its feet. Lennie Derby was brought in as manager, but it was not until the 1999-2000 that things improved when they were runners-up to Alliance new boys Oadby Town. The next two seasons saw Stratford setting the pace and sitting top of the table at Christmas. However, spells of bad weather and postponements led to a backlog of fixtures with Town failing to hold onto the top spot.

For the 2002-03 campaign, Stratford were in contention for most of the season, but it was not until the last game of the Season that Rushall, pipped Stratford for 2nd place. Stratford won the League Cup for the first time beating Causeway United 1-0, with Leon Mitchell getting the goal in extra time. The 2003-04 season a win or a draw in the last game of the season against Willenhall at Masons Road, would secure 2nd place and promotion but Willenhall won and gained the promotion spot. It was a shock when Lennie Derby resigned in January 2005. In his 6 years at the Club he had been close to promotion several times. With his departure Assistant Manager Ian Britton took charge for the rest of the season.

After a good pre-season build up to the 2005-06 season hopes were high, but this form was not transferred to the new League campaign. With results not improving and not being able to bring in new faces to strengthen the Squad, manager Ian Britton resigned. Former player Dennis Mulholland was appointed as the new manager, as Stratford were still having a mixed bag of results and eventually finished 14th in the League at the end of the season, their lowest position for a number of years.

The 2007-08 season saw the appointment of Micky Moore and Town riding high in the MFA until a disastrous post-Christmas run put an end to any promotion hopes. The 2008-09 season was Town's first full one at its new Knights Lane facility and expectations were high for the season ahead. An historic run in the FA Vase ended in 5th round defeat to eventual winners Whitley Bay but again league form was inconsistent. Micky Moore paid the price at the end of the season. New manager Rod Brown was appointed, with the task of bringing that elusive promotion top of his list of priorities. A first season finish in third place was followed by a dismal start to the 2010-11 season and by September Brown had left.

Former player Morton Titterton replaced Brown, once again a top six finish was gained, along with a fine end of season league cup win over Boldmere St Michaels. The 2011-12 season was again disappointing and Carl Adams was brought in as co-manager for the 2012-13 campaign. Unfortunately Morton Titterton had to relinquish his duties leaving Carl Adams in sole charge. Town went top of league in early September and remained there, securing the title with 4 games left to play thus ending their 19 season stay in the MFA and promotion to the Southern League Div 1 South & West.

The 2014-15 season saw the majority of the previous year's squad re-signed and together with some additional signings Town made an impressive start hitting the top of the table after 10 consecutive wins. Despite a poor run of results around the turn of the year they produced a 12 match unbeaten run to secure a 3rd place finish and reach the play off's. Having overcome Taunton Town 2-1 in the semi-final they beat Lakhall Athletic in the final in front of a ground record crowd of 1054 supporters to gain promotion to the Evostik Southern Premier League.

After winning promotion to the Southern League Prem the 2015-16 season was all about survival. The previous season's end of season form continued with Town making a bright start to life at the highest level in their history. By Christmas Town were comfortable in mid table but a poor run of form into the new year meant a promising start turned into a 19th place finish. Season 2016-17 saw Town finish in 14th place and but for 17 drawn games could have a lot higher. Most of the squad have re-signed for the coming season which in addition to six new signings will hopefully see Town consolidate their position at this level.

LAST TIME OUT

KING'S LYNN TOWN 5-0 DUNSTABLE TOWN HT (2-0)

Dunstable survived sustained early pressure from the home team who looked to capitalise on the momentum of claiming Hereford's scalp. However shots were largely off target with the Dunstable defence showing bravery and resilience. It wasn't all one way traffic, Andrew Osei-Bonsu troubled his defenders all afternoon and in the 10th minute his shot on goal produced a good save from Alex Street in the Lynn goal. Ten minutes later following good work from Ryan Young, Andrew again shot on goal although this time defenders blocked his shot.

There was a certain degree of good fortune to the King's Lynn opener on 36 minutes as a corner from the Dunstable left produced a game of ping pong in the box with the ball eventually falling to Craig Parker to break Dunstable resistance. King's Lynn had had the lion's share of possession and had forced Will Hunt into several good saves already. One nil quickly became 2-0 and again there was an element of good fortune attached to it as Ryan Hawkins popped up to steer the ball in off the post following a wonderful save from Will. Will was again called into action in first half stoppage time diving at full stretch to turn the ball away from a header destined for the bottom corner.

Two down at half time, Dunstable would have felt themselves somewhat hard done by that both goals on another day could have been cleared. Ty Ward took a free kick in the first few second half minutes which needed a smart save from Alex Street, but only a minute later a thunderous header from Ryan Fryatt straight from a corner put the Lynn three goals ahead.

If you read these reports regularly or if you come and watch the Lads play at Creasey Park, you'll know by now, that irrespective of the score they will still try and play open attacking football and resist any lingering temptation to revert to "hoofball", spoiling tactics or drop their heads. Never was this more evident than just before the hour mark when some delightful crisp, sharp passing culminated in a 30 yard cross field pass from Andrew Osei-Bonsu right on to the feet of Ryan Young who zipped across the turf down to the bye line only to see his cross go behind and out of play.

Nik succumbed to what looked like a recurrence of his hamstring injury and was replaced by Erin Amu and just a couple of minutes after Will had produced another good save, King's Lynn scored a 4th fourth through substitute Tom Siddons before fellow substitute Eoin McQuaid added a fifth.

Dunstable made King's Lynn work for their victory for this was no easily earned stroll in the park. Credit to our Lads for putting in a fine team performance with solid performances all round. The Steward who showed us out at the end made Will Hunt the Man of The Match and indeed he was with some outstanding saves during the match.

Evo-Stik League South Premier leaders King`s Lynn Town were ruthless on Tuesday night as they showed no mercy to rock-bottom Gosport Borough, running out 7-1 winners at Privett Park.

Ryan Hawkins completed a hat-trick in the 14th, 46th and 52nd minutes. Dion Fray had opened the scoring after just 5 minutes, with Joe Lea replying on 35 minutes, but Ryan Fryatt (57 minutes), Michael Gash (81) and Tom Siddons (90) saw the Linnets make it 19 goals in their last four matches and a four-point lead at the top of the table.

Hereford FC moved into second spot after a 2-0 win against lower mid-table Bishop`s Stortford at Edgar Street. A crowd of 1,772 saw Bishop`s Stortford reduced to ten-men after Callum Taylor was sent-off in the first half following an elbow on Ryan Green. Jamie Bird opened the scoring for the Bulls with a fine individual effort 3 minutes after half-time. Then Lance Smith bundled the ball home 10 minutes later to double the home side`s lead.

Hereford are now second, but possess four games in hand on Lynn and most around them bar a now fifth-placed Slough Town, who recovered from last weekend`s 3-0 defeat at Tiverton Town to move above them following a 4-0 win over Redditch United at Arbour Park.

The Rebels took an 8th minute lead when Ben Harris capitalised on a poor back-pass and touched the ball past keeper Ethan Rose before slotting home. It was 2-0 with 25 minutes gone on the clock when Warren Harris crossed low for James Dobson to lash home. Six minutes into the second half, Dobson played in Gavin James, who held the ball up for Harris to shoot low past Rose. And 5 minutes from time Redditch`s bad night was complete when defender James Mutton sent a cross from Dobson into his own net.

Tuesday`s other game saw Banbury United miss the opportunity to put pressure on the top five when they were held to a 1-1 draw at the Spencer Stadium by mid-table Basingstoke Town. Banbury started well and went ahead in the 8th minute when a fierce Tom Winters

free-kick from 20 yards saw Colm McAdden only able to knock the shot away to the incoming Luke Carnell who fired the ball home from the edge of the six-yard box. The second half saw Basingstoke have the better of proceedings and they got their reward for their efforts 6 minutes from time when Ben Wright scored to earn the visitors a point. The draw leaves Banbury four points behind the play-off places.

Chalfont St Peter moved into fourth place in the Evo-Stik League South East table, six points behind leaders AFC Rushden & Diamonds, after winning 2-0 at Chestnut Avenue against mid-table Northwood. But the Saints left it late. Somehow the game remained goalless until the 87th minute – and that despite Northwood hitting the crossbar and their keeper Xavi Lomas making several fine saves. It was Jake Cass who broke the deadlock and then 4 minutes into stoppage time, Rob Hastings made sure with a second for the visitors.

Aylesbury FC hadn`t managed a goal since their Boxing Day derby win over Aylesbury United and went into their home game with lowly Fleet Town on the back of four successive defeats. Well, the Moles managed to bring an end to both of those statistics, although they could only share the spoils. It took them only 9 minutes to score their first goal of 2018 from Alfi Touceda. However, Brad Wilson earned the Hampshire side a point with a 79th minute equaliser.

Evo-Stik League South West leaders Taunton Town must have thought their advantage at the top would be cut on Tuesday after they could only manage a 2-2 draw at Paulton Rovers. However, they returned to the dressing room to discover that second-placed Salisbury FC had been beaten at in-form Didcot Town. But it could have been worse for Taunton as they found themselves 2-0 down inside 12 minutes following goals from Dale Evans and former Peacock Omar Simpson who scored with a fine volley. Recent signing Keith Emmerson netted goals in the 77th and 78th minutes as Taunton hung on to their unbeaten away record in the league – and stretch their lead at the top to nine points following the White`s 3-1 set-back at Didcot.



10 FEBRUARY 1991 - THE HAIR WAS HOLDING HIM BACK

On 10 February 1991, Zinedine Zidane scored his first professional goal to help Cannes beat Nantes.

Nineteen years old at the time, Zidane had been with Cannes since joining them as a youth player in 1986. He signed a professional contract with them in 1989 and made his first-team debut against Nantes that May, one of only two appearances that season.

He didn't play for the first team at all the next season, but featured regularly in 1990-91, making a total of 31 appearances across all competitions. His only goal, though, came in a 2-1 league win over Nantes.

Afterward, club chairman Alain Pedretti gave Zidane a car, honoring a promise he'd made to the midfielder for his first scoring strike.

Zidane left Cannes for Bordeaux in 1992, then spent time with Juventus (1996-2001) and Real Madrid (2001-06) while becoming one of the world's greatest players. He went on to score a total of 125 goals in 681 career club appearances, while winning the Ballon d'Or in 1998 after leading France to victory in the World Cup.

A Premier League statement confirmed: *"The Premier League has been in discussions with the FA and EFL for several months regarding the challenges of the increasingly congested English football calendar and ways in which we can work together to ease fixture congestion while also giving players a mid-season break."*

So what for the Non-League pyramid as the Premier League sets its sights on an improved deal from Sky Sports and BT Sport? Should a European-style winter break come from the deal, all Non-League clubs would have 21 days to attract fans through the turnstiles to watch our own brand of football. Some people may not appreciate this notion but just because you support a Premier League or a Championship club does not mean you cannot appreciate watching a game along with 250 others rather than 25,000.

Being a Leyton Orient fan I frequently overhear regular supporters sat around me talking to a friend they have brought along who may follow Arsenal or Spurs and there is a genuine interest in talking about the O's. I've heard plenty of talk about disgruntled Sunderland fans taking in the goal fests often served up by South Shields this season, so it's encouraging to see the club's stadium developments be utilised.

In recent years I've been to Sydney and Cape Town and I have seen enough replica shirts from England's top league to know Richard Scudamore doesn't have to worry about a loss in profit anytime within the next 20 years. So can't more be done to assist more clubs with the basic necessities of acquiring defibrillators and other essentials? - **Adam Ellis**
