### INSIDE THE BOARDROOM

I WOULD LIKE TO WISH A VERY WARM WELCOME TO THE COMMITTEE, COACHING AND PLAYING STAFF AND SUPPORTERS OF BALDOCK TOWN



We finally kick off our SSMFL season. We hope all our visitors have an enjoyable evening and we see a good game of football. Last season's match here went our way, winning 2 -1. The away fixture was one of the fixtures that was lost due to the early cancellation of the season.

Baldock sit proudly on top of the table after the first few games having won 4-1 away at Aylesbury Vale Dynamos on Saturday. We know this will be a tough match and Baldock are likely contenders for the title's crown.

Saturday's Emirates FA Cup Preliminary Round tie against Easington Sports was as nail-biting and heart stopping as the previous Wednesday's affair. All square at the end of 90 minutes and again it was thanks to several cool heads in our ranks to put away the resulting penalties, and Dan Gould's sensational save, that got us over the line.

By the time you read this we will know our opponents in the First Qualifying Round. This is the stage where teams from Step 3 enter the draw. At this stage last season, we came up against Bishops Stortford who exposed a couple of our Achilles Heels before a second half comeback of epic proportions had the away team reeling on the ropes for a period. Last season it was at this next stage that we went out of the FA Cup and an early exit at the first stage of the Vase away at AFC Hayes still earned the club £7K in prize money. If history repeats itself this season, we will be rewarded with only £3.5K in prize money. The FA's coffers have been hit hard by Covid-19 and they too must balance the books, although the draconian reduction in FA competitions prize money will only adversely affect many nonleague teams all struggling to keep their heads above water

These games are of huge importance to us, not just for pride, self-belief, the good name of the club, but the prize money helps keep us ticking over, so I can only say a huge thank you to all of you who were there on Saturday and vocally got behind the lads. The atmosphere was fantastic, and I genuinely know how much the gaffers and the players really appreciated it.

Some good news off the pitch to report. The Luton & Dunstable Hospital were very impressed by our "all in it together" £20K for 20K Crowdfunding Appeal and even though we fell short of the initial target they are keen to support us as official Charity Partners for the remainder of the season as we carry on our efforts. We hope to announce the appointment of a Fund-Raising Officer to work with the Hospital in organising fund-raising initiatives.

Individual Player sponsorships are already three quarters taken but we still have plenty of Match & match ball sponsorships available for you to support us either individually or through your business.

Finally, we are away at Ampthill next Saturday in the FA Vase. It will be a tough local derby and I know Gareth will have done his homework and will not underestimate our opposition. It would be great to see as many of you as possible there to cheer the lads on and hopefully see us through to the next round.

### OPPOSITION SPOTLIGHT



### HAVING ORIGINALLY BEEN ESTABLISHED IN 1905, THE CURRENT VERSION OF THE CLUB WAS ESTABLISHED IN 2003

They are currently members of Spartan South Midlands League Premier Division and groundshare with Arlesey Town at their Hitchin Road ground. The club were founded in 1905 as Baldock Football Club and joined the Northern Division of the Herts County League for the 1905–06 season.

They won the division in 1920–21 and finished as runners-up in the championship play-off. In 1921 they were renamed Baldock Town, and league reorganisation saw them placed in the North Eastern Division.

The league was reduced to a single division in 1923, and the 1924–25 season saw the club finish as runners up. However, the league was disbanded at the end of the season, and the club joined Division One of the Bedfordshire & District County League (later renamed the South Midlands League), with the reserves playing in Division Two.

They won the league in 1927–28, and although they finished bottom of Division One in 1929–30, they avoided being relegated to Division Two.

They remained in Division One until World War II. After the war Baldock re-joined the Herts County League, finishing bottom of Division One in 1946–47.

They then switched back to the South Midlands League, winning Division Two in 1947–48 and earning promotion to Division One; the reserves subsequently joined Division Two.

The club won Division One in 1949–50 and were promoted to the Premier Division. After finishing as runners-up in 1953–54, they left the league, switching to the Parthenon League. They remained in the league for five seasons, before joining the Senior Division of the London League, finishing bottom of the division in 1959–60.

However, after four seasons they re-joined the Premier Division of the South Midlands League. They subsequently won the league in 1965–66, 1967–68 and 1969–70.

In 1983 Baldock switched to the Premier Division of the United Counties League, finishing as runners-up in their first season. After finishing as runners-up again in 1986–87, they were promoted to the Southern Division of the Southern League. They remained in the division until the end of the 1994–95 season, which saw them finish as runners-up, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

However, they were relegated back to the Southern Division at the end of the 1996–97 season. In 1999 the club was transferred to the Eastern Division when the league was restructured

After the 2000–01 season they left the league and folded. In 2003 the club was reformed as Baldock, with the team composed of former members of the Baldock Town youth team.

They joined Division One of the North Hertfordshire League. After finishing third in 2004–05, they were promoted to the Premier Division. The club were founder members of the North & Mid Herts League in 2006 and were placed in the Premier Division. During the year, the club was renamed Baldock Town.

After finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division, they were promoted to Division One of the Herts County League. They won the division at the first attempt, earning promotion to the Premier Division. In 2008 they were renamed again, this time becoming Baldock Town (Letchworth) following a move to playing home matches in Letchworth. However, they reverted to being Baldock Town in 2011 after returning to Baldock, playing at Baldock Town FC's former home at Norton Road, which is now known as the North Herts Arena.

After three near misses, the 1st Team finally won the Herts Senior County League Premier Division title in 2011/12. Unfortunately, due to ground grading issues, the team were unable to take their place in the SSMFL.

For the 2012/13 season, the team began a groundshare with Hitchin Town FC. Despite finishing runners-up in the HSCL Premier Division the following season, it would still prove enough to secure that elusive promotion. Scott Grant's side also won the Herts Senior Centenary Trophy for the first time and retained the Anagram Records Trophy.

After Grant decided to step down Luke Gregson took the reins for the 2015/16 season, assisted by Dean Gilbert. After an indifferent start, the team went on a superb run and ended up just missing out on promotion.

At the end of the 2018-19 season Luke Gregson stood down and former Welwyn Garden City manager Adam Fisher took over.

Fisher's side started slowly and only began to pick up some form at the end of November shortly after Rob Bates came on board as Assistant Manager bringing some key signings with him — Baldock went on an impressive unbeaten run climbing the table before the pandemic brought the season to a premature end.

In the summer of 2020 Adam Fisher resigned as manager and the club promoted Assistant Manager Rob Bates to the Manager's position.

Rob has brought in his own management team and has also retained 90% of last season's squad ahead of the 2020-21 season.

The team currently groundshare at Arlesey Town FC's ground; there are plans in place to build a new stadium in Baldock near Clothall Common.

### MATCH REPORT

### **DUNSTABLE TOWN 1-1 EASINGTON SPORTS**



A second penalty shoot-out victory in ten days saw Dunstable Town progress to the First Qualifying Round of the FA Cup on Saturday afternoon, at the expense of Easington Sports of Banbury.

The Blues wasted no time in opening the scoring when George Mulonda saw his low long-range shot nestle in the bottom corner past the outstretched arms of visiting goalkeeper Joe White, with just three minutes played.

The visitors took their deficit largely in their stride, and almost levelled three minutes later when a glancing header bounced harmlessly away after hitting the post.

Town looked largely comfortable throughout the first half, though Easington did create half-chances, most notably when a free-kick to the back post was headed down into the middle of the box, but a lack of precision saw the resulting shot trouble only the stand behind the goal.

Chris Stapleton looked to provide the Blues with the cutting edge to win them the tie, challenging for every loose ball and allowing the visiting defence no peace, and this culminated when he found space towards the end of the half, but he couldn't keep his shot down and saw it sail over the upright.

Five minutes after the break the away side had levelled things at 1-1, when scrambling defenders couldn't block a header at the back post.

After equalising, Easington went on the hunt for a second, and almost immediately saw a long-range shot cannon off the post, to the relief of much of the 138-strong crowd at Creasey Park.

Dylan Fitzpatrick and Joe Hankins showed neat link-up play on the hour-mark, and the move ended with a full-stretch Stapleton glancing a header wide of the mark.

As with the previous round, Dunstable pressed hard for a winner in the later stages of the match, hoping to avoid the agonising tension of a penalty shoot-out, but there were no Pobbeesque heroics this time, until a nerve-wracking shoot-out saw the Blues win in sudden death. A win is the most important thing in any cup tie, but manager Gareth Jackson will hope to hit full stride in the coming weeks with the league and FA Vase getting underway.

The draw for the next round took place on Monday, with the ties being played week commencing 21st September.

#### FOLLOW GUIDELINES OR FANS FACE FRESH BAN!

The Non-League Paper hit newsstands today as clubs are being urged to stick to the Football Association's Covid-secure guidelines to have any hope of grounds staying open after nationwide restrictions tighten on Monday.
